Table 1 provides a summary of grant allocations for the 2023/24, 2024/25 and 2025/26 financial years. This includes the organisations funded, project details, grant amounts, geographical areas and the communities each project stated it intended to benefit.

- 3. An anonymised breakdown of successful applicants by community or communities served**

Almost all successful applicant organisations were led by people from Black, Asian and minority ethnic communities, LGBTQ+ communities or disabled people in Wales. Consistent information on applicants was not provided. However, information held by the Welsh Government indicates that successful applications included organisations led by, or representing the following communities:

- Black, Asian and minority ethnic communities;
- Nigerian communities;
- Roma and Gypsy communities;
- South Asian communities;
- Indian communities
- Refugees and asylum seekers;

- 4. The anonymised information for unsuccessful applications, including the number of applications received and successful applications by broad community served**

Following a search of our paper and electronic records, I have established that some of the information you require is not held by the Welsh Government. I have set out

below the information held by the Welsh Government. I believe that Diverse Cymru/Adferiad holds information which you are seeking. You can ask them for the information at info@diverse.cymru.

In 2023, the Welsh Government received 74 applications in the first round of the scheme from Black, Asian and minority ethnic led community groups and organisations across Wales, including organisations supporting ethnic minority communities.

In 2024, the Welsh Government received more than 70 applications in the second round of the scheme from a diverse range of Black Asian and minority ethnic led community groups and organisations across Wales.

In 2025, the Welsh Government received just over 100 applications in the third round of the scheme from community groups and organisations led by Black, Asian and minority ethnic communities, LGBTQ+ communities and disabled people across Wales. It is estimated that 63% of the grant allocation support Black, Asian and Ethnic Minority led or participatory projects, 22% of projects support disabled people, 9% of projects are attributed to LGBTQ+ and 6% where applications fit more than one strand.

5. Monitoring or evaluation data used to assess whether the programme achieved equitable access and representation across different communities

An evaluation of the culture, heritage and sport ArWAP grants programme was carried out over three financial years up to December 2024. This evaluation examined the delivery and impact of the scheme and is available at [Evaluation of the Culture, Heritage and Sport ArWAP Grants Programme](#).

7. Information about the process used to ensure that grassroots organisations and communities were able to participate in, or help shape, the programme

The Welsh Government did not provide any specific guidance to Diverse Cymru or Adferiad regarding the inclusion of less visible or underrepresented communities. The scheme was designed to address barriers to funding access experienced by minority ethnic communities. The Welsh Government focused on improving accessibility to funding and increasing participation among these groups. In 2025/26, the scheme was expanded to include projects led by, or supporting, disabled people and LGBTQ+ communities.

8. Clarification of the precise roles and relationships between organisations referred to in the Welsh Government evaluation in connection with community engagement and oral-history activity, including The Mentor Ring, EYST, Sanatam Mandir and Sri Dasmais Singh Sabha Gurdwara. In particular, which organisation received funding for the relevant activity and whether these organisations were direct delivery partners or were listed because of their separate involvement in the wider programme.

Organisations funded through the Grassroots Culture Grant Scheme worked with a range of community organisations to deliver project activities. The evaluation report contained a full list of community organisations that these projects worked with. For example, Route 47 CIC delivered the Hidden Voices project with £5,000 of funding in 2023/24. As part of this work, the organisation engaged with community members at the Sanatam Mandir and Sri Dasmais Singh Sabha Gurdwara to connect with Hindu and Sikh communities. This project also engaged with EYST and the Mentor Ring.
