### Revision to "Communities First: 2012 Baseline"

### **Correction Page, 17 November 2015**

This is to inform users that a correction page has been produced for the Communities First: 2012 Baseline Report. This is due to the identification of an error in the raw data used to produce the Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation (WIMD) Indicator Analysis 2012. The revised data affects the indicator "Percentage of population in receipt of income-related benefits" for Communities First Clusters.

#### Detail of the error

The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) discovered an error in the income indicator data they had provided for the income domain of WIMD which relates to the accidental exclusion of some data on tax credits.

#### **Data Affected**

Within each of the 52 cluster profiles, only one indicator is affected: "Percentage of population in receipt of income-related benefits", within the Prosperous Communities Indicators. The error affects the individual Communities First Areas and the All Communities First values. The Local Authority values and the overall Wales value are unaffected by this error.

The WIMD ranks shown in the profiles also remain unchanged. This is because the ranks are taken from WIMD 2011 which is unaffected by the error.

More recent updates to the income indicator for Communities First Areas have been published on StatsWales as part of the 2013 and 2014 WIMD Indicator datasets. These have also been revised<sup>1</sup> as a result of the error, which affected data for 2012, 2013 and 2014.

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#### Introduction

This report provides a baseline for each of the Communities First clusters, following the realignment of the programme in April 2012.

It brings together a wealth of data on each Community First cluster – including from the Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation 2011 and the 2011 Census.

#### What is Communities First?

Communities First is a Community focussed programme that supports the Welsh Government's Tackling Poverty agenda.

The programme builds on the achievements of Communities First since its launch in 2001 and preserves the best of the current programme. It supports the most disadvantaged people in our most deprived areas with the aim of contributing to alleviating persistent poverty.

Communities First Delivery Teams funded by the Welsh Government work with residents, community organisations, business and other key agencies in these areas, called Clusters, and will focus on actions leading to the long term sustainability and wellbeing of communities. Involving local people in all aspects of this work is an essential feature of the programme.

Communities First aims to contribute, alongside other programmes, to narrowing the education/skills, economic and health gaps between our most deprived and more affluent areas.

The Programme has three strategic objectives helping to achieve these outcomes: Prosperous Communities
Learning Communities
Healthier Communities

#### How were Communities First areas defined?

Communities First Cluster areas were determined according to criteria published by the then Minister for Local Government and Communities in November 2011. Each Cluster is based around the most deprived areas in Wales according to the Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation 2011, with a particular focus on the most deprived 10 per cent. Other areas were included, where it could be justified, on the basis of natural community boundaries; alignment with boundaries for key partner services; addressing particular aspects of poverty; or engagement with particular groups of vulnerable people. The final boundaries of each Cluster were agreed by the Minister on the basis of applications received from the local Lead Delivery Bodies, based on these criteria. The 52 Clusters contain, between them, all of the areas now considered eligible for inclusion in the programme.

#### Geographies Used - Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs)

Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs)¹ were designed by the Office for National Statistics to have consistent population sizes and stable geographies, so that statistical comparisons of small areas over time can be carried out. Although the geographical size of these small areas varies quite widely, the populations are intended to be roughly the same in each LSOA, with an average population of 1600 people. SOA boundaries are revised following each Census, to take into account of changes in the population. In the 2001 Census there were 1,896 LSOAs. Following the 2011 Census there are now 1909 LSOAs.

The 52 Communities First Clusters are comprised of a number of Lower Layer Super Output Areas (LSOAs), usually around 7-10. For most clusters, around half of the LSOAs are in the most deprived 10% in Wales as identified in the Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation 2011. Details of how the Community First Clusters have been affected by the revision of LSOAs can be found in Annex A.

The maps included within this report, and the WIMD 2011 data are based on the boundaries at the time the clusters were originally formed. The 2011 Census data is based on the 2011 boundaries. This only affects a small number of areas – more information is provided on the relevant cluster pages and in Annex A.

#### What is WIMD?

#### Overview

The Welsh Index of Multiple deprivation 2011<sup>2</sup> is the official measure of relative deprivation for small areas in Wales. It was produced by the Welsh Government. The Index was developed as a tool to identify and understand deprivation in Wales, so that funding, policy, and programmes can be effectively focussed on the most disadvantaged communities. WIMD 2011 updates the Index published in 2008, without imposing methodological changes, except where data provision makes the unavoidable. The next Index is due for publication in late 2014.

The Index is produced as a set of ranks, with a rank of 1 assigned to the most deprived area. Ranks are a relative system of measurement; we can know which areas are more (or less) deprived than others, but not by how much. This is because of the way that the Index must be constructed.

The ranks of the Index are calculated for each of the 1896 lower layer super output areas (LSOAs) of Wales. **WIMD 2011 uses the 2001 LSOA boundaries**.

#### How is the index constructed?

The Index is constructed from a weighted sum of the deprivation score for each domain. The weights reflect the importance of the domain as an aspect of deprivation, and the quality of the indicators available for that domain. The domains and their weights for WIMD 2011 are:

income	23.5%	geographical access to services	10%
employment	23.5%	community safety	5%
health	14%	physical environment	5%
education	14%	housing	5%

#### Format of Report

The report includes individual Communities First area profiles containing:

- a statistical table outlining key demographics of the population within the area;
- an Ordnance Survey map of the Communities First area;
- a statistical table with the ranks from the Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation 2011 (WIMD 2011);
- brief analysis of WIMD 2011, focussing on concentrations of deprivation within the small areas (LSOAs);
- a statistical table with further contextual information (including WIMD indicator data and 2011 Census)

A glossary is included at Annex B. Further technical information on the indicators included is provided at Annex C. Information on Data Quality is provided at Annex D.



Employment and Income are the next most prominent types of deprivation (each with 3 LSOAs in the most deprived 10 per cent for those domains) followed by Community Safety (with 2 LSOAs in the most deprived 10 per cent for Community Safety).

With no LSOAs in the cluster within the most deprived 10 per cent of areas in the Health and Education domains, these represent types of deprivation that are of less significance to the cluster. With no LSOAs in the most deprived 30 per cent of areas in the Access to Services domain, this represents a type of deprivation that is of even less significance to the cluster.

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

The Gwynedd Communities First cluster is made up of parts of Cadnant, Marchog, Peblig and Talysarn. The area has been formed from 5 smaller statistical areas with a total population of 8,900 people. The Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation (WIMD) is produced at this small area (LSOA) level. The 1,896 small areas in Wales are ranked with 1 being the most deprived.

According to WIMD 2011, 3 of the small areas in this cluster are in the most deprived 10 per cent of small areas in Wales: Marchog 1, Marchog 2 and Peblig (see map). The most deprived LSOA within the cluster is Peblig (ranked 119).

Within the cluster there are differences across both domains and individual LSOAs in the intensity of deprivation.

Across the cluster the most prominent type of deprivation is Housing, having 5 LSOAs in the most deprived 10 per cent of areas in Wales for Housing (highlighted bold and italic in the table).

Community Safety is the next most prominent type of deprivation (with 4 LSOAs in the most deprived 10 per cent for Community Safety) followed by Income and Education (each with 3 LSOAs in the most deprived 10 per cent for those domains).

With no LSOAs in the cluster within the most deprived 10 per cent of areas in the Employment and Access to Services domains, these represent types of deprivation that are of less significance to the cluster. With no LSOAs in the most deprived 40 per cent of areas in the Physical Environment domain, this represents a type of deprivation that is of even less significance to the cluster.

The 1,896 small areas in Wales are ranked with 1 being the most deprived.

According to WIMD 2011, 1 of the small areas in this cluster is in the most deprived 10 per cent of small areas in Wales: Tredegar Park 2 (see map).

Within the cluster there are differences across both domains and individual LSOAs in the intensity of deprivation.

Across the cluster the most prominent type of deprivation is Physical Environment, having 4 LSOAs in the most deprived 10 per cent of areas in Wales for Physical Environment (highlighted bold and italic in the table).

Employment and Income are the next most prominent types of deprivation (each with 3 LSOAs in the most deprived 10 per cent for those domains) followed by Health and Education (each with 1 LSOA in the most deprived 10 per cent for those domains).

With no LSOAs in the cluster within the most deprived 10 per cent of areas in the Access to Services and Community Safety domains, these represent types of deprivation that are of less significance to the cluster. With only one LSOA in the most deprived 50 per cent of areas in the Housing domain, this represents a type of deprivation that is of even less significance to the cluster.

## Glossary of terms

## Average point score

## Key Stage 2 (KS2)

Pupils are assessed by teachers in English/ Welsh, Science and Maths during Year 6, the final year of primary school. Higher levels of attainment receive a higher score.

#### Key Stage 3 (KS3)

Pupils are assessed by teachers in English/ Welsh, Science and Maths during Year 9, the third year of secondary school. Higher levels of attainment receive a higher score.

## Key Stage 4 (KS4)

Results from GCSEs and equivalent qualifications.

## Dependent child

A dependent child is a person aged 0–15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16–18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.

# Economically active persons (excluding students) who are classified as International Labour Organisation unemployed

A person aged 16 to 74 is classified as unemployed if they are not in employment are available to start work in the next two weeks, and either looked for work in the last four weeks or are waiting to start a new job. Full-time students are not included.

#### Household

A household is defined as:

- one person living alone, or
- a group of people (not necessarily related) living at the same address who share cooking facilities and share a living room or sitting room or dining area.

#### This includes:

- sheltered accommodation units in an establishment where 50 per cent or more have their own kitchens (irrespective of whether there are other communal facilities)
- all people living in caravans on any type of site that is their usual residence. This will include anyone who has no other usual residence elsewhere in the UK.

A household must contain at least one person whose place of usual residence is at the address. A group of short-term residents living together is not classified as a household, and neither is a group of people at an address where only visitors are staying.

#### Households living in owner occupied accommodation

This includes households whose accommodation is owned outright, owned with a mortgage/loan or part owned and part rented.

# Households living in rented accommodation from the Local Authority or Registered Social Landlord

This includes those who rent from a housing association, housing cooperative or charitable trust.

# Households living in rented accommodation from a private landlord, letting agency or other sources

This includes those who rent from an employer of a household member, a relative or friend of a household member or living rent free.

## Households that are single pensioner households

These are single person households in which the individual is aged 65 years or older.

#### Households which are lone parent households with dependent children

A lone parent family consists of a father or mother with his or her child(ren) where the parent does not have a spouse, same-sex civil partner or partner in the household and the child(ren) do not have a spouse, same-sex civil partner or child in the household. A lone grandparent with his or her grandchild(ren) are also considered a lone parent family if there are no children in the intervening generation present in the household (note that children of the grandparent may also be present if they are not parents or grandparents of the youngest generation).

#### Households which are overcrowded

Occupancy rating provides a measure of whether a household's accommodation is overcrowded or under occupied. The ages of the household members and their relationships to each other are used to derive the number of rooms they require, based on a standard formula. The number of rooms required is subtracted from the number of rooms in the household's accommodation to obtain the occupancy rating. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household has one fewer room than required, whereas +1 implies that they have one more room than the standard requirement. Households are defined as overcrowded if the occupancy rating is less than 0.

The definition of a room does not include bathrooms, toilets, halls or landings, or rooms that can only be used for storage. All other rooms, for example, kitchens, living rooms, bedrooms, utility rooms, studies and conservatories are counted.

If two rooms have been converted into one they are counted as one room. Rooms shared between a number of households, for example a shared kitchen, are not counted.

The number of rooms is not available for unoccupied household spaces.

## Households with dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0–15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16–18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.

## Households with dependent children who do not have an adult in employment

A person is defined as employed (or in employment) if in the week before the census they carried out at least one hour's paid work, either as an employee or self-employed. This includes casual or temporary work, on a government-sponsored training scheme, doing paid or unpaid work for their own or family business, being away from work ill, on maternity leave, or on holiday or temporarily laid off.

#### Households with no cars or vans

A household is not included if there are cars or vans that are owned, or available for use, by one or more members of the household (this includes company cars and vans that are available for private use but it does not include motorbikes or scooters, or any cars of vans belonging to visitors). Cars or vans used by residents of communal establishments are not counted.

## Households with no central heating

A household's accommodation is classified as having central heating if it is present in some or all rooms (whether used or not).

## Households with one or more person with a limiting long-term illness

A long-term health problem or disability that limits a person's day-to-day activities, and has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months. This includes problems that are related to old age.

#### Low birth rate

Low birth weight is defined as live singleton birth weight less than 2500g

**Level 4+ qualifications**: Degree (for example BA, BSc), Higher Degree (for example MA, PhD, PGCE), NVQ Level 4-5, HNC, HND, RSA Higher Diploma, BTEC Higher level, Foundation degree (NI), Professional qualifications (for example teaching, nursing, accountancy)

Unknown qualifications: Vocational/Work-related Qualifications,

Foreign Qualifications (Not stated/level unknown).

Foreign qualifications which are known to be equivalent to one of the above levels are included in that levels indicator.

## Persons who describe themselves as not being in good health

General health is a self-assessment of a person's general state of health. People were asked to assess whether their health was very good, good, fair, bad or very bad. This assessment is not based on a person's health over any specified period of time. Those that answered fair, bad or very bad are included in this indicator.

## Persons who identify themselves as of a Minority Ethnic Background

This includes all ethnicities that are non-white.

#### Persons who provide unpaid care

A person is a provider of unpaid care if they look after or give help or support to family members, friends, neighbours or others because of long-term physical or mental ill health or disability, or problems related to old age. This does not include any activities as part of paid employment.

No distinction is made about whether any care that a person provides is within their own household or outside of the household, so no explicit link can be made about whether the care provided is for a person within the household who has poor general health or a long-term health problem or disability.

## Persons who state their religion as other than Christian

This includes all religions stated other than Christian. It does not include those with no religion or those who did not state a religion.

#### Persons whose main language is not English or Welsh who can speak English

Main language is the language that is a person's first or preferred language. This indicator includes those whose main language is not English or Welsh and who can speak English to any extent.

#### Usual resident

The main population base for outputs from the 2011 Census is the usual resident population as at census day 27th March 2011. Although the population base for enumeration included non-UK short-term residents, these are analysed separately and are not included in the main outputs from the 2011 Census. All outputs, unless specified, are produced using only usual residents of the UK.

For 2011 Census purposes, a usual resident of the UK is anyone who, on census day, was in the UK and had stayed or intended to stay in the UK for a period of 12 months or more, or had a permanent UK address and was outside the UK and intended to be outside the UK for less than 12 months.

## Working age persons who are economically active

A person aged 16 to 74 is described as economically active if, in the week before the census, they were:

- in employment, as an employee of self-employed
- not in employment, but were seeking work and ready to start work within two weeks, or
- not in employment, but waiting to start a job already obtained and available.

## 16-24 year olds who are not in employment or education (NEET)

For these statistics, a person is NEET if they are aged 16 to 24 and not in education, employment or training.

A person is considered to be in education or training if they:

- are doing an apprenticeship;
- are on a Government employment or training programme;
- are working or studying towards a qualification;
- have had job-related training or education in the last four weeks;
   or
- are enrolled on an education course and are still attending or waiting for term to (re)start.

Therefore, anybody aged 16 to 24 who is not in the above forms of education or training and who is not in employment, is considered to be NEET. The definition of "in employment" follows that used for the official labour market statistics. This definition is based on that recommended by the International Labour Organisation (ILO).

## Population in receipt of income-related benefits

Data Source: Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation Indicator Analysis 2012.

This indicator is created from data supplied by the Department for Work and Pensions and the Home Office.

Data from November 2010, February 2011, May 2011 and August 2011 were used to calculate this indicator.

The Income Deprivation indicator is a single composite indicator calculated from the following three elements.

- (a) Percentage in receipt of income related benefits
- (b) Dependent child receiving tax credits with income less than 60 per cent of the Wales median
- (c) NASS-supported Asylum Seekers

The above are counts of unique individuals (i.e. duplicates removed). The indicators can be summed and expressed as a percentage of the total population for the LSOA

a) Percentage in receipt of income related benefits.

This indicator is formed from the combined count of the yearly (Feb, May, Aug, Nov) average of Income Support (IS) claimants, Jobseekers Allowance (JSA) claimants, Pension Credit (PC) claimants, Income Based Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) claimants and the number of dependents on claimants of IS, JSA, PC, ESA, all divided by the total population. Data is collected from the WPLS and is not subject to sampling error, as it is a 100 per cent survey.

b) Dependent child receiving tax credits with income less than 60 per cent of the Wales median (before housing costs)

The number of people claiming the Child Tax Credit and the Working Tax credit, with an income less than 60 per cent of the Wales median (before housing costs). A three year average is used for Wales median earnings, at the prices of the latest year in the average.

c) NASS-supported Asylum Seekers

The number of National Asylum Support Service (NASS) supported Asylum seekers at the end of December 2010 are also added to this indicator.

#### Children in households in receipt of income-related benefits

This indicator is calculated as above but specifically for children (LSOA population aged 0-18 years old).

Data from November 2009 to August 2010 were used to calculate this indicator.

## Population in receipt of employment-related benefits

Data Source: Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation Indicator Analysis 2012.

This indicator is created from data supplied by the Office for National Statistics and the Department for Work and Pensions.

A combined count of a yearly average from November 2010, February 2011, May 2011 and August 2011 were used to calculate this indicator.

This was formed from the combined count of:

- Claimants of Incapacity Benefit/ Severe Disablement Allowance (IBSDA).
   Incapacity Benefit claimants are those of working age who are unable to work due to illness or disability and who meet criteria contribution conditions. All three rate categories of claimants are included (short-term lower, short-term higher and long term). Severe disablement Allowance is available to those people who are incapable of work and do not satisfy the contribution conditions of Incapacity Benefit.
- 2. Claimants of New Deal for Young People (NDYP), New Deal for 25+ (ND25+), and New Deal for Lone Parents (NDLP)This indicator captures young people (18-24) who have been claiming JSA for at least 6 months and persons 25+ who have been claiming JSA for at least 2 years and have therefore moved into the New Deal programme. This indicator was chosen as it captures people who are on a scheme which encourages them back to work, but who have not found employment yet and are not picked up on the JSA count. The New Deal for Lone Parents (NDLP) is designed specifically to help lone parents aged 16 or over who are not working, or who are working less than 16 hours per week, and who have sole responsibility for the care of a child(ren) under the age of 16.
- 3. Claimants of Jobseekers Allowance (JSA). This indicator captures all persons of working age (18-59 for women and 18-64 for men), who are claiming Job Seekers Allowance, available to those who are actively seeking work, but not in work.
- 4. Claimants of Employment and Support Allowance (ESA), this indicator captures all persons of working age (18-59 for women and 18-64 for men),

who are claiming Employment and Support Allowance. It is available to people who are unable to work because of illness or disability, and those who are able to work. ESA has replaced Incapacity Benefit for new claimants since October 2008.

## 16-24 year olds who are not in employment or education (NEET)

Data Source: Annual Population Survey (APS)

A three year average of data from 2010, 2011, and 2012 were used to calculate this indicator.

For these statistics, a person is NEET if they are aged 16 to 24 and not in education, employment or training.

A person is considered to be in education or training if they:

- are doing an apprenticeship;
- are on a Government employment or training programme;
- are working or studying towards a qualification;
- have had job-related training or education in the last four weeks; or
- are enrolled on an education course and are still attending or waiting for term to (re)start.

Therefore, anybody aged 16 to 24 who is not in the above forms of education or training and who is not in employment, is considered to be NEET. The definition of "in employment" follows that used for the official labour market statistics. This definition is based on that recommended by the International Labour Organisation (ILO).

Please note that due to the adoption of a UK harmonised methodology for defining young people who are NEET, the LA estimates are not directly comparable with the other estimates provided. This is a result of the new apportionment method for handling missing values.

Where there were multiple offenders at a single address a weight of 2 was applied. Care homes and institutions were excluded from the counts.

Low birth weight is defined as live singleton birth weight less than 2500g. Evidence suggests that low birth rate is linked to the mother's lifestyle and health. Low birth rate can also cause problems for a baby in later life increasing the risk of chronic diseases.

## Cancer incidence rate (number per 100,000)

Data Source: Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation Indicator Analysis 2012.

This indicator is created from data supplied by the Velindre NHS Trust.

Data from 2001 to 2010 were used to calculate this indicator.

## Percentage of the population who are obese

Data Source: Welsh Health Survey

Data from 2010 and 2011 were used to calculate this indicator. See table 8 of Welsh Health Survey, 2010 and 2011: Local authority and health board results.

This data is from the Welsh Health Survey (WHS) in which adults were asked to report their height and their weight. In order to define overweight or obesity, a measurement is required which allows for differences in weight due to height. The Body Mass Index (BMI) is calculated as weight (kg) divided by squared height (m²). However, BMI does not distinguish between mass due to body fat and mass due to muscular physique, nor does it take account of the distribution of fat.

BMI was calculated for all respondents, excluding pregnant women, with valid height and weight measurements and classified into the following BMI groups:

BMI (kg/m <sup>2)</sup>	Description	
Less than 18.5	Underweight	
18.5 to under 25	Healthy weight	
25 to under 30	Overweight	
30 and over	Obese	

Height and weight of respondents are self-reported, and there is evidence to show that some people tend to under-report weight and/or over-report height, resulting in an under-estimation of the prevalence of overweight and obesity.

## Average male/female life expectancy

Data Source: Office for National Statistics (ONS)

Data from 2008, 2009 and 2010 were used to calculate this indicator.

Life expectancy at birth for an area in a given time period is an estimate of the average number of years a new-born baby would survive if he or she experienced the particular area's age-specific mortality rates for that time period throughout his or her life. It is not therefore the number of years a baby born in the area in that time period could actually expect to live, both because the death rates of the area are likely to change in the future and because many of those born in the area will live elsewhere for at least some part of their lives. The method for calculating the figure uses abridged (grouped years) life tables and deaths registered each year.

Children whose parents receive the following support payments are entitled to receive free school meals in maintained schools in Wales:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and their annual income does not exceed £16,190. (HM Revenue and Customs are responsible for assessing the level of annual income.)
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit.
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

Young people who receive Income Support or Income Based Job Seekers Allowance in their own right are also entitled to receive free school meals.
