### **HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES**

The material in the first eight tables relates to health and essentially covers the services. activities and financial arrangements of the National Service. Rising expectations and advances in medical science and techniques have. amongst other influences. made financing of the health services a major public issue. The first three tables seek to show the main financial trends as they have operated in Wales. Thus the broad pattern of expenditure (Table 10.1) shows that out of a total of about £180m in 1973-4 £36m was spent on local authority services, £100m on services (hospitals) provided directly by Health Authorities and about £38m in general medical. dental. pharmaceutical and ophthalmic services. By 1991/2 the balance had changed: the total was £2,100m with £318m on local authority services, £1,200m directly by Health Authorities and £430m on the general services. Two points, which are also broadly relevant to Tables 10.2 and 10.3, need to be added. First a reminder that these tables are in current pounds and would need adjustment to allow for inflation. Second is the need to notice that legislative and policy changes over the organisation and structure of the health services were increasingly implemented from c1990 and had repercussions on the financial arrangements. In the case of Table 10.1, for example, as the notes indicate, the category 'Other' leaps upwards as it includes G.P. fund-holding, while direct expenditure by Health Authorities is from 1992 affected by the way the finances of the hospital Trusts are treated.

The structural changes, of course, affect all aspects of the NHS, but fortunately for the present purposes they, for the most part, only seriously began to influence the data at the tail end of this series. The notes to the tables should be read with care, but there is no reason to think that, for example, the

trends in the number of staff and the users of the various services (Table 10.4) are misleading. Much the same would apply to material on the provision of hospital beds by county (Table 10.6) showing both the diversity (relative to population) and the substantial decline. Although statistics on the number of private nursing homes and hospitals (Tables 10.7 and 10.8) are only readily available since 1986 (and thus would normally have been excluded because of too short a run) they represent too significant a development in the provision of health services in Wales to be left out. The increase probably represents an already existing trend which was given a substantial boost by the changes from the late 1980s in the way, and the terms on which, services (especially for the elderly) were provided. With more certainty it can be said (Table 10.9) that there was already a tendency for the typical general practice to have more doctors even before the introduction of fundholding.

The social services, like health but for different reasons, have experienced a general rise in demand during this period. Table 10.10 shows, for example, the overall rise in total staff against its changed distribution away from residential accommodation partly in response to the programme of Care in the Community. Although based on a sample the information on retirement pensions (Table 10.11) is reliable (as are Tables 10.12, 10.13, 10.14 and 10.15. Family Credit, Child Benefit, Supplementary Benefit and Income Support) when read in conjunction with the notes. The final table on drug addicts does not purport to record the number of people in Wales using drugs: it deals only with those who were - so to speak - 'officially recognised' and accorded direct medical treatment and assistance.
