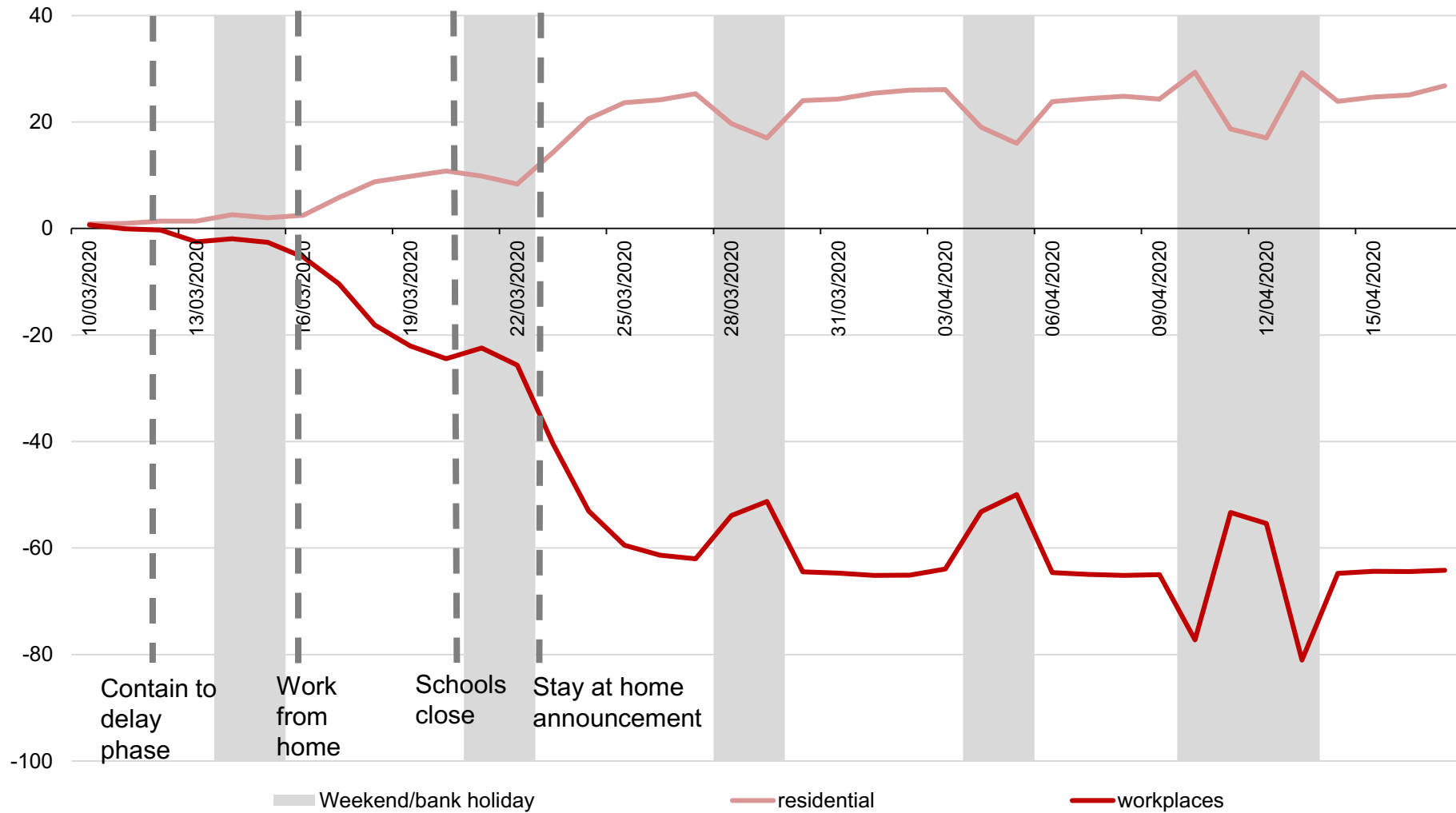


SOCIAL DISTANCING

Food parcel orders submitted to suppliers:

- **7,572** up to 27 April
- Includes **78** received over the weekend 25/26 April

Attempted deliveries:

- **8,666** up to 23 April (3,000 were redeliveries)
- **98%** handed to resident or left on doorstep

of **£534,480**

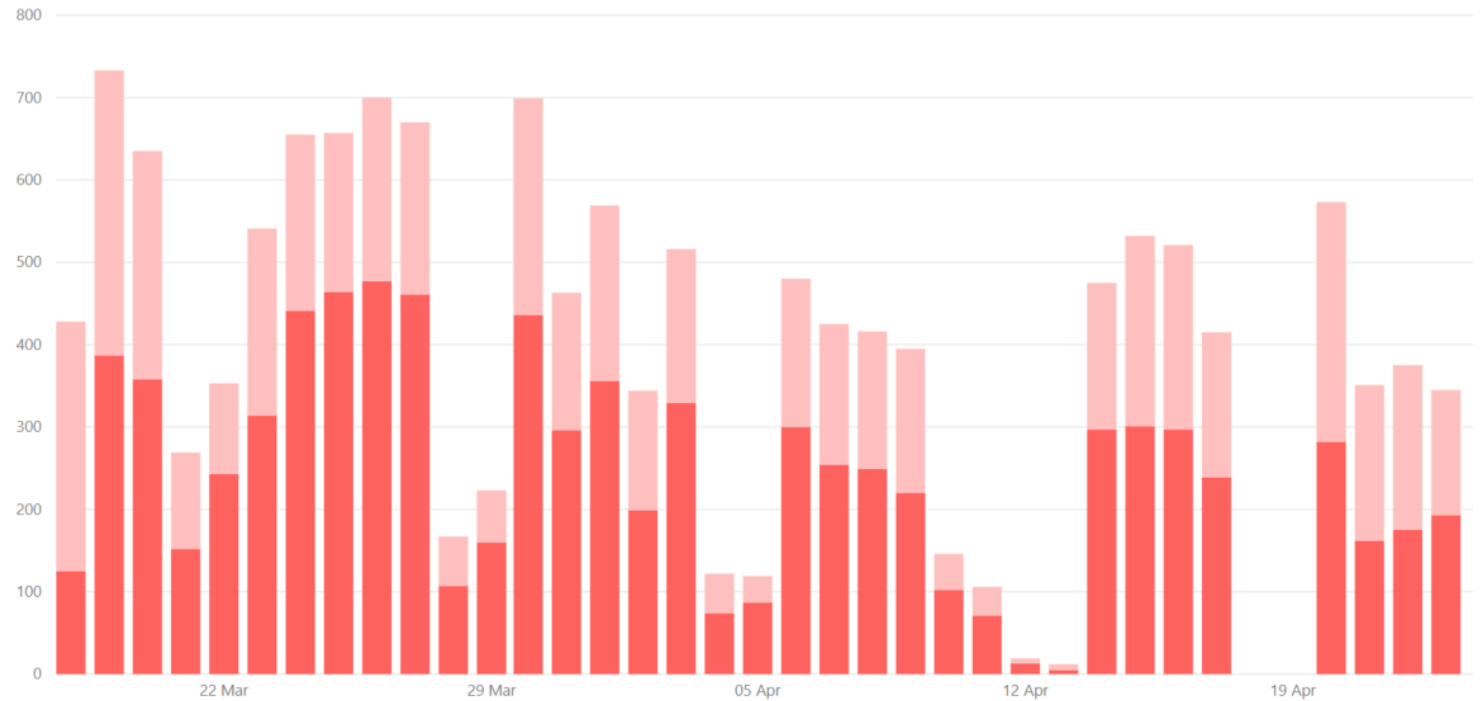
Recording started on 18 March. COVID-19 related reasons applicants are presenting include

- Having to stop or reduce work
- Delay to benefit claim
- Increased energy/food costs (family at home)

To date, the increase in claims is partly due to more frequent applications by people who have previously claimed EAPs.

● a. Covid-19 related EAP payments ● b. Normal EAP payments

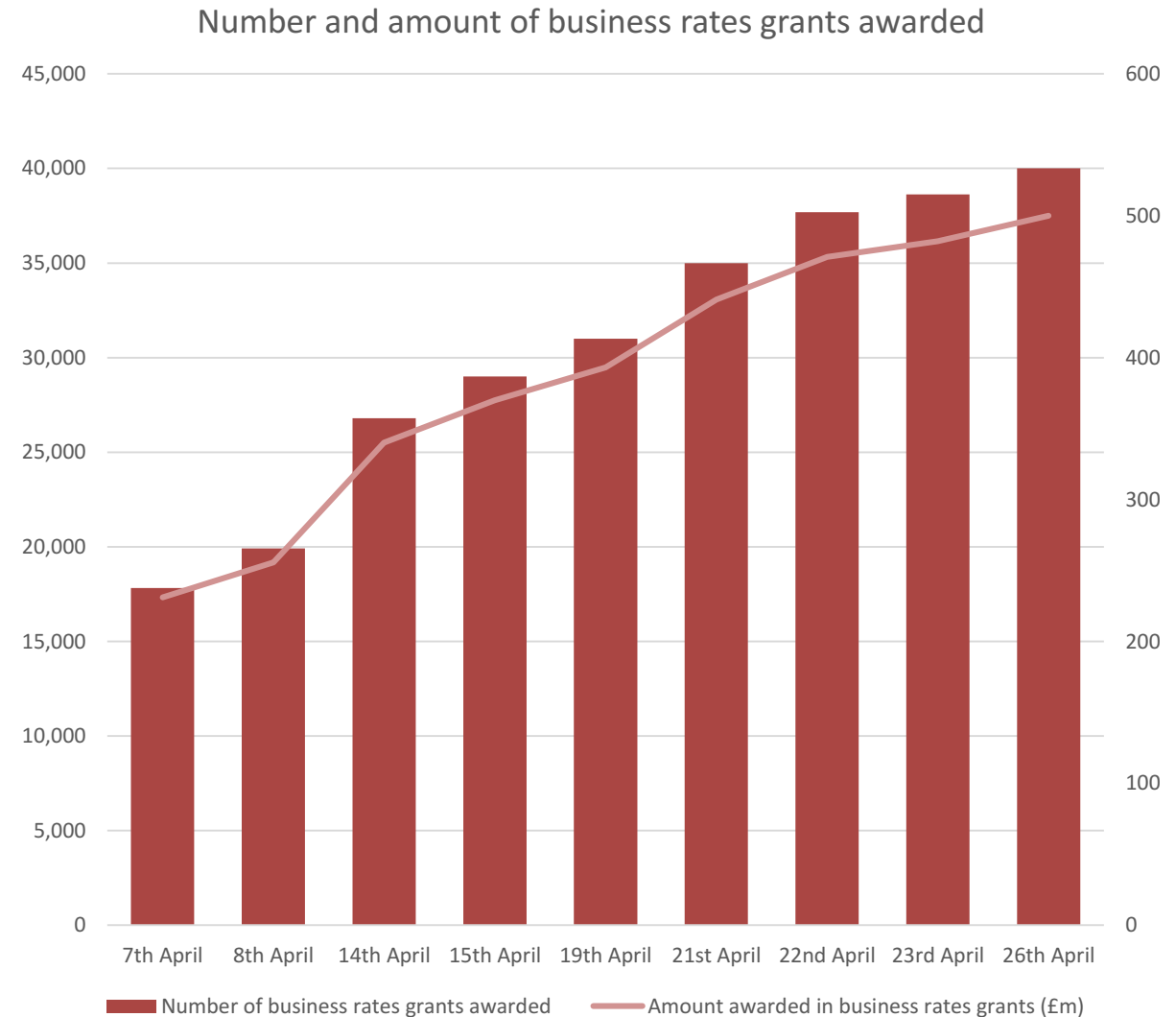


SUPPORT FOR BUSINESSES

Local authorities have so far issued **40,000** business rates grants totalling almost **£0.5bn**.

The Development Bank's COVID-19 Wales Business Loan Scheme received **1,608** applications totalling **£103m**. **585** businesses across Wales have been awarded funding totalling **£36m**.

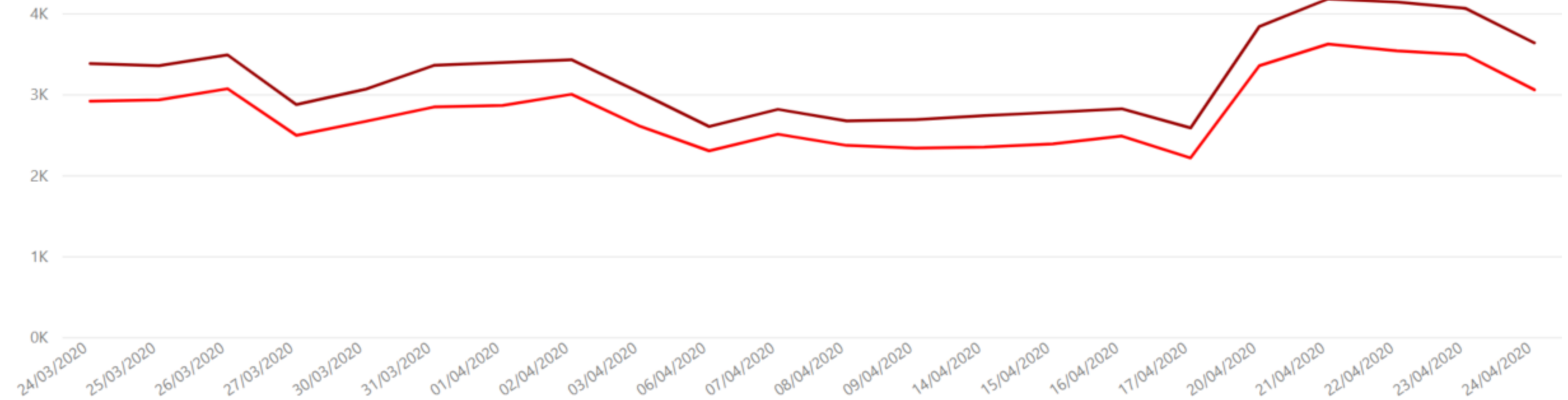
The Economic Resilience Fund has so far received over **6,500** micro-business applications totalling **£63.5m**, and almost **2,500** SME applications totalling **£138.6m**. The Larger Business Fund has received over **£26m** worth of applications, with further applications being processed which show the applications will likely increase to about **£28m**.
