Telephone and online surveys

For 2022-23 all participants will be asked to complete a 10 minute online survey after they have completed the telephone survey with an interviewer.

At the end of the telephone survey, the interviewer will email and text respondents the survey link and Unique Access Code (UAC) which they will need to log into the survey. Like the telephone survey, the online questionnaire can be completed in Welsh or English.

If a respondent is not able to complete the online survey (if they do not have internet for example), they will be offered a telephone version of the online survey to complete over the phone with the same interviewer.

Filtering of questions

Some questions within modules only apply to those who have answered in a particular way to an earlier survey question. This filtering information is provided in the questionnaire above each question. For example:

- ASK ALL Question is asked of all respondents for whom the module applies.
- ASK IF 1 OR 3 AT WelSpk Question is asked only of respondents for whom the module applies and whose answer at the question labelled WelSpk was response option 1 or 3.

Soft and hard checks

A range of checks are built in to the computer implementation of the questionnaire to ensure that responses are in a sensible range (for variables like height) and are consistent with each other (for example, so that respondents can't both give an answer to a question and also say they don't know the answer). These checks are either 'soft' checks, so the interviewer gets an error message but can choose to suppress it and continue; or 'hard' checks, so the response must be corrected before the moving on to the next question.

In the telephone survey, soft and hard check error messages will appear will be displayed as pop-up boxes to prompt interviewers. Checks in the online survey will be displayed in red for respondents.

Like the telephone survey, all question in the online survey require a response, however respondents can select 'Don't know' and 'Prefer not to say' response options. If no response is selected in the online survey, the following error message in red will appear: 'Please provide an answer in order to move on to the next question'.

Guide to question format

All questions in the survey questionnaire follow a similar format. Below is a guide to interpreting the format.


Text in bold:

- **Telephone survey** The wording of the question to be read out by the interviewer to the respondent will always be displayed in bold type.
- Online survey Text in bold is what will appear on screen for the respondent to read (usually also presented in bold for the respondent).

Text in non-bold type and capitals or brackets refers to survey coding frame instructions (see text boxes below for more information). These do not appear on screen in the online survey.

Each response option in the survey is allocated a numerical code to enable statistical analyses; e.g. 'Don't know' is '-9'. In the online survey, these codes are not visible to respondents on screen.

Question sources

The question's previous inclusion in the National Survey is marked under the question / variable label. For example, NS 1920 indicates the question was last included in the National Survey in 2019-20. NS NEW indicates the question is included in the National Survey for the first time in 2022-23. Where no other source is marked, this indicates a new question has been developed specifically for the National Survey.

Questions are taken from existing surveys where possible. Where relevant, the source is also marked under the question / variable label and the year of the source survey is given (e.g. SHS 2016 refers to the Scottish Household Survey in 2016). Where the question or answer options differ from the original source, the question source is marked with an "a" (adapted).

'SPONTANEOUS ONLY'

For all questions, interviewers are able to choose 'refuse' or 'don't know' for respondents.
