


Museums as catalysts for equality, diversity and inclusion

Museums can support the creation of inclusive communities through their work. By creating exhibitions, activities and events with traditionally excluded groups, museums can help people to see their stories as a part of the identity of Wales.

In 2022:

- 34 per cent of museum staff are Welsh speakers.
- 17 per cent of museums have engaged in all 5 of the priority activities listed in the Anti Racist Wales Action Plan.
- 79 per cent of museums provided programming related to some of the protected characteristics.
- National museums and National Trust sites have carried out a recent access audit.
 Other museums are falling behind.
- Only 2 independent and 4 local authority museums have developed and enacted Equality and Inclusion Action Plans.


