


Museums as community learning organisations


Museums in Wales deliver an impressive range of informal and formal learning services to their communities. Where they had the resources to do so, many adapted and offered services during the pandemic. In 2022 museums welcomed learners back and although numbers remain below pre-pandemic levels they are growing again.

In 2022:

- Museums had 319,664 learning participants
- There were 5,463 formal learning sessions with 160,123 participants
- Museums worked with 2,895 formal learning organisations
- There were 2,156 informal learning sessions with 159,541 participants




