



Strengthening Social Cohesion for the Future

Museums in Wales deliver an impressive range of informal and formal learning services to their communities. These include in person and digital learning sessions and activities. Spotlight 2024 shows how these services are developing and growing.

In 2024:

- Museums had 521,308 learning participants.
- There were 12,147 formal learning sessions with 235,381 participants, digitally and in person.
- Museums worked with 3,994 formal learning organisations.

We have used UCL's Wellbeing Toolkit with two primary schools in 2024. Pupils of both schools took part in two separate long-term projects with the museum and the results showed an increase in wellbeing at 16% and 20% respectively.
